Vision: We graduate classically educated ladies and gentlemen with abiding faith and whose lives’ works are joyfully submitted to the Lord Jesus Christ.

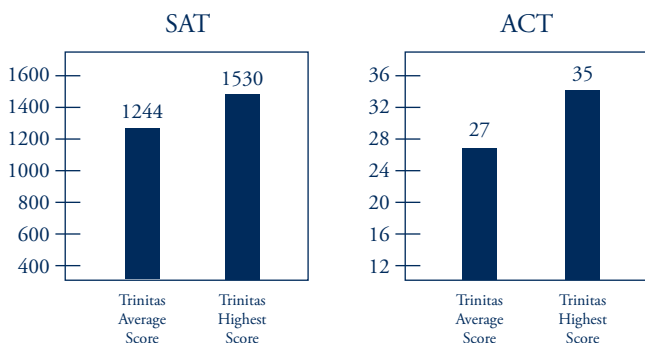

Calculation of GPA, Senior Awards, and Senior Class Ranking:

Grade Point Average (GPA) is based on a 4.0 scale. Honors points, although awarded, are not calculated into the GPA.

Honors are awarded to seniors on the basis of their cumulative grade point averages between ninth and twelfth grades.

1. Cum laude (with honors) is bestowed upon students who complete the Trinitas graduation requirements with a cumulative GPA between 3.5 and 3.69.

2. Magna cum laude (with high honors) is bestowed upon students who complete the Trinitas graduation requirements with a cumulative GPA between 3.7 and 3.84.

3. Summa cum laude (with highest honors) is bestowed upon students who complete the Trinitas graduation requirements with a cumulative GPA between 3.85 and 4.0.

The two students with the highest and second highest numerical averages for all graded courses, grades 9th through 12th excluding dual enrollment courses, will be named valedictorian and salutatorian, respectively. Students are ranked in the same manner regarding numerical averages.
